

NASSAU COUNTY
EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 3
(Emergency Management – COVID-19)

WHEREAS, the Governor issued Executive Orders 20-80 and 20-82; and

WHEREAS, said Orders provide for individuals arriving through airports or by other transportation from the New York Tri-State area (Connecticut, New Jersey and New York) are to isolate or quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days from the time of entry into the State of Florida, or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Orders do not apply to persons employed by the airlines and those performing military, emergency or health response; and

WHEREAS, this Executive Order also provides for providing specific information as to number of guests occupying rooms and origin of State and City from which they departed; and

WHEREAS, all persons in isolation or quarantine are responsible for all costs associated therewith; and

WHEREAS, based on past information, individuals from the New York Tri-State area have traveled to Nassau County by automobile and through the Fernandina Beach Airport; and

WHEREAS, based upon the Governor's Order it is apparent that the safety of Nassau County residents could be adversely affected by individuals arriving from the New York Tri-State Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, MICHAEL S. MULLIN, as Nassau County Manager, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Local State of Emergency and County Emergency Management Plan and with the consent of the Emergency Management Director, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

SECTION 1. Effective March 27, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. any individual arriving in Nassau County by automobile, or any other method of motorized transportation or local Fernandina Beach Airport, from the New York Tri-State area shall isolate or quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days from the time of entry into Nassau County, Florida or the duration of the person's presence in Nassau County, whichever is shorter.

SECTION 2. Any person from the New York Tri-State area who arrived in Nassau County on March 23, 2020 to March 27, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. and is still in Nassau County as of the date of this order shall isolate or quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days from the date of March 23, 2020 or for the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.

SECTION 3. This Order shall not apply to those performing military, emergency or health responders or individuals on Federal contracts.

SECTION 4. All persons isolating or quarantining shall be responsible for all costs associated with that person's isolation and quarantining including transportation, lodging, food, medical care and any other expenses to sustain the person during the period of isolation or quarantine.

SECTION 5. The lodging establishment or any person or entity that is subject to the local Tourist Development Tax shall report to the Nassau County Health Department the names of the individuals from the New York Tri-State area occupying a room within a lodging establishment

or room within any structure that is subject to the Tourist Development Tax. The names shall be provided telephonically and by electronic mail to the Nassau County Health Department upon accepting a reservation or check-in at the lodging establishment or room subject to the Tourist Development Tax. The lodging establishments, or any person or entity that is subject to the local Tourist Development Tax, shall provide all guests from the New York Tri-State area with a copy of this isolation and quarantine order.

SECTION 6. The lodging establishments or any person or entity that is subject to the local Tourist Development Tax shall advise anyone from the New York Tri-State area who is inquiring about rooms that there is a mandatory self-isolation/quarantine requirement for anyone arriving in Nassau County from the New York Tri-State area.

SECTION 7. The lodging establishments and short-term rental companies shall provide the Convention and Visitors Bureau, daily, the numbers of occupants and location of origin (State and City) for each occupant.

SECTION 8. Individuals arriving and disembarking at the Fernandina Beach Airport from the New York Tri-State area shall provide their names, home addresses, and the address they are occupying in Nassau County to City of Fernandina Beach Municipal Airport personnel, or its designated airport representatives, to be submitted to the Nassau County Health Department. In addition, each person disembarking shall be provided with a copy of this order and the Governor's Executive Order 20-80.

SECTION 9. The Convention and Visitors Bureau shall notify all Nassau County lodging establishments and all short-term rental companies of the Governor's Executive Orders 20-80 and

20-82 and this order. Further, the Convention and Visitors Bureau shall maintain a daily log indicating a daily count and origin of all visitors occupying lodging establishments or rooms subject to the Tourist Development Tax.

SECTION 10. The failure of lodging establishments or any person or entity subject to the Tourist Development Tax to comply with the provisions of this Order will be considered a violation and subject the violators to a second-degree misdemeanor punishable by sixty (60) days in jail and/or a \$500.00 fine.

SECTION 11. The failure of any other person who fails to comply with the provisions of this order will be considered a violation and subjects the violator to a second-degree misdemeanor punishable by sixty (60) days in jail and/or a \$500.00 fine.


SECTION 12. Any person from the New York Tri-State area who violates the self-isolation or self-quarantine by failure to remain within the confines of the address within which they are staying for the mandatory length of time can be subject to prosecution under §252.50 or §381.00315(e), Florida Statutes, which, if convicted, is punishable up to sixty (60) days imprisonment and a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

SECTION 13. The County is adopting this Executive Order pursuant to the State Declaration of Emergency and Nassau County's Declaration of Local Emergency and pursuant to Florida Statutes, §381.0016.

SECTION 14. This Executive Order shall expire at the expiration of the declaration of the Local State of Emergency.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 4
(Emergency Management – COVID-19)

WHEREAS, the Governor issued Executive Orders 2020-80 and 2020-82; and

WHEREAS, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-87 that suspended the rental of vacation properties and prohibited new reservations or bookings and the acceptance of new guests for check-in; and

WHEREAS, the Governor had previously issued Executive Order 2020-80 that addressed individuals arriving, through commercial airports, from the New York Tri-State area (New York, New Jersey and Connecticut); and

WHEREAS, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-82 that addresses individuals arriving from an area with substantial community spread to include the State of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, Nassau County issued Local Executive Order 3 that addressed individuals arriving from the New York Tri-State area by motorized vehicles and through the Fernandina Beach Airport; and

WHEREAS, Local Executive Order 3 required the lodging establishments that are subject to the local Tourist Development Tax agency to provide reports to the Nassau County Health Department and the Convention and Visitors Bureau; and

WHEREAS, Nassau County has lodging establishments including hotels and motels and other public lodging establishments that are not subject to the Tourist Development Tax; and

WHEREAS, based upon the Governor's Executive Orders 2020-80 and 2020-82, Nassau County finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens to issue this Local Executive Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, MICHAEL S. MULLIN, as Nassau County Manager, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Local State of Emergency and County Emergency Management Plan and with the consent of the Emergency Management Director, promulgate the following Executive Order to take effect on April 2, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.:

SECTION 1. Effective April 2, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. any individual arriving in Nassau County by automobile, or any other method of motorized transportation or local Fernandina Beach Airport and Jacksonville International Airport, from the State of Louisiana shall isolate or quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days from the time of entry into Nassau County, Florida or the duration of the person's presence in Nassau County, whichever is shorter.

SECTION 2. Any person from the State of Louisiana who arrived in Nassau County on March 24, 2020 to April 2, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. and is still in Nassau County as of the date of this order shall isolate or quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days from the date of March 24, 2020 or for the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.

SECTION 3. This Order shall not apply to those performing military, emergency or health responders or individuals on Federal contracts.

SECTION 4. All persons isolating or quarantining shall be responsible for all costs associated with that person's isolation and quarantining including transportation, lodging, food, medical care and any other expenses to sustain the person during the period of isolation or quarantine.

SECTION 5. As required by Local Executive Order #3, the lodging establishments or any persons or entity(s) that are subject to the local Tourist Development Tax shall continue to report to the Nassau County Health Department the names of the individuals from the New York Tri-State area and now the State of Louisiana occupying a room within a lodging establishment or room within any structure that is subject to the Tourist Development Tax. The names shall be provided telephonically and by electronic mail to the Nassau County Health Department upon accepting a reservation or check-in at the lodging establishment or room subject to the Tourist Development Tax. The lodging establishments, or any person or entity that is subject to the local Tourist Development Tax, shall continue to provide all guests from the New York Tri-State area and now the State of Louisiana with a copy of this isolation and quarantine order and Governor's Executive Orders 2020-80 and 2020-82.

SECTION 6. The lodging establishments and short-term rental companies and individuals renting short-term rentals within Nassau County, outside of the Tourist Development District, shall also report to the Nassau County Health Department the information required in Section 5.

SECTION 7. The lodging establishments or any person or entity that is subject to the local Tourist Development Tax shall continue to advise anyone from the New York Tri-State area and now the State of Louisiana who is inquiring about rooms that there is a mandatory self-isolation/quarantine requirement for anyone arriving in Nassau County from the New York Tri-State area and the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 8. The lodging establishments and short-term rental companies and individuals who rent short-term rentals in Nassau County, outside the Tourist Development District, shall provide the same information to individuals as set forth in Section 7.

SECTION 9. The lodging establishments and short-term rental companies that are subject to the Tourist Development Tax shall continue to provide the Convention and Visitors Bureau, daily, the numbers of occupants and location of origin (State and City) for each occupant. In addition, all lodging establishments, within Nassau County, not subject to the Tourist Development Tax, shall also report the same information to the Convention and Visitors Bureau.

SECTION 10. Individuals arriving and disembarking at the Fernandina Beach Airport from the New York Tri-State area and now the State of Louisiana shall provide their names, home addresses, and the address they are occupying in Nassau County to City of Fernandina Beach Municipal Airport personnel, or its designated airport representatives, to be submitted to the Nassau County Health Department. In addition, each person disembarking shall be provided with a copy of this order and the Governor's Executive Orders 2020-80 and 2020-82.

SECTION 11. The Convention and Visitors Bureau shall notify all Nassau County lodging establishments and all short-term rental companies and individuals who rent short-term rentals, including those not subject to the Tourist Development Tax, of the Governor's Executive Orders 2020-80, 2020-82, 2020-87 and this order. Further, the Convention and Visitors Bureau shall maintain a daily log indicating a daily count and origin of all visitors occupying lodging establishments or rooms subject to the Tourist Development Tax and said log shall be provided daily to the County Manger's office.

SECTION 12. The failure of lodging establishments and short-term rental companies or individuals who "rent out" short-term rentals located within Nassau County, both within the Tourist Development District and outside the Tourist Development District, to comply with the

provisions of this Order will be considered a violation and subject the violators to a second-degree misdemeanor punishable by sixty (60) days in jail and/or a \$500.00 fine.


SECTION 13. Any person from the New York Tri-State area or State of Louisiana who violates the self-isolation or self-quarantine by failure to remain within the confines of the address within which they are staying for the mandatory length of time can be subject to prosecution under §252.50 or §381.00315(e), Florida Statutes, which, if convicted, is punishable up to sixty (60) days imprisonment and a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

SECTION 14. The County is adopting this Executive Order pursuant to the State Declaration of Emergency and Nassau County's Declaration of Local Emergency and pursuant to Florida Statutes, §381.0016.

SECTION 15. This Executive Order shall expire at the expiration of the declaration of the Local State of Emergency.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-80

(Emergency Management - COVID-19 – Airport Screening and Isolation)

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, I issued Executive Order number 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, many cases of COVID-19 in Florida have been as a result of individuals coming into the State of Florida from international travel and other states and exposing our residents; and

WHEREAS, Florida is seeing an increase in individuals fleeing to Florida from states where “shelter-in-place” orders are being implemented, including from the New York Tri-State Area; and

WHEREAS, as Governor, I am responsible for meeting the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, Chapter 252,

Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1.

A. I hereby direct all persons whose point of departure originates from outside the State of Florida in an area with substantial community spread, to include the New York Tri-State Area (Connecticut, New Jersey and New York), and entering the State of Florida through airports to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter. This Order shall not apply to persons employed by the airlines and those performing military, emergency or health response. This Order shall take effect on March 24, 2020 at 12:01 a.m. All persons isolating or quarantining under this Section, shall be responsible for all costs associated with that person's isolation or quarantine, including transportation, lodging, food, medical care and any other expenses to sustain the person during the period of isolation or quarantine.

B. I hereby direct the Florida Department of Health, pursuant to section 381.00315(5), Florida Statutes, to immediately apply existing rules adopted pursuant to that section. The Florida Department of Health shall take any steps necessary to ensure the screening and appropriate isolation and quarantine of individuals covered by this Order.

C. I hereby direct the Florida Department of Health to coordinate with the Florida Division of Emergency Management, each aviation and airport authority in Florida, county and local governments, and law enforcement agencies to effectuate the isolation or quarantine outlined above.

D. Pursuant to section 381.0012(5), Florida Statutes, "it shall be the duty of every state and county attorney, sheriff, police officer, and other appropriate city and county officials

upon request to assist the [Department of Health]" in enforcing any isolation or quarantine or order of the Department of Health issued pursuant to this Order.

E. Any person who violates any isolation or quarantine directed by the Department of Health commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, which is punishable by imprisonment not to exceed 60 days, a fine not to exceed \$500, or both. *See* § 381.00315(6), Fla. Stat.

Section 2. This Executive Order shall expire upon the expiration of Executive Order 20-52, including any extensions, or upon an Executive Order lifting the isolation or quarantine after advice from the State Health Officer and Surgeon General.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-82

(Emergency Management - COVID-19 –Isolation of Individuals Traveling to Florida)

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, I issued Executive Order number 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, many cases of COVID-19 in Florida have resulted from individuals coming into the State of Florida from international travel and other states, posing great risk to Florida residents; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-80 requiring the screening, isolation and quarantine of individuals whose point of departure originated outside the State of Florida in an area with substantial community spread, to include the New York Tri-State Area; and

WHEREAS, Florida is experiencing an increase in individuals fleeing to Florida from states where “shelter-in-place” orders are being implemented, including from the New York Tri-State Area; and

WHEREAS, as Governor, I am responsible for meeting the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1.

A. I hereby direct all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the New York Tri-State Area (Connecticut, New Jersey and New York), to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter. This Order shall not apply to persons employed by the airlines and those performing military, emergency or health response. This Order shall take effect immediately and apply retroactively to all persons who have entered Florida after being in any area with substantial community spread within the previous 14 days. All persons isolating or quarantining under this Section shall be responsible for all costs associated with their isolation or quarantine, including transportation, lodging, food, medical care and any other expenses to sustain the person during the period of isolation or quarantine.

B. I hereby direct all persons covered under Section 1(A) of this Order to inform any individual in Florida with whom they have had direct physical contact in the past 21 days that they traveled from an area with substantial community spread.

Section 2. Failure to follow Section 1 of this Order is a second-degree misdemeanor pursuant to section 252.50, Florida Statutes, and is punishable by imprisonment not to exceed 60 days, a fine not to exceed \$500, or both.

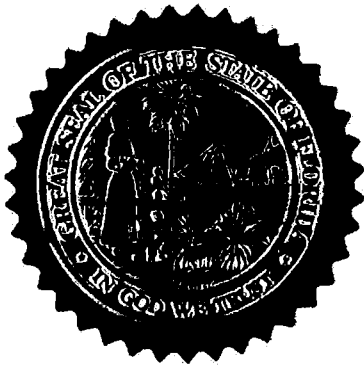
Section 3.

A. Pursuant to section 252.47, Florida Statutes, I hereby direct all state, county and local law enforcement authorities to enforce this Order. Any law enforcement authority that interacts with a


person in violation of Section 1(A) of this Order shall immediately report the individual, along with personal identifying and contact information, to the Florida Department of Health.

B. Pursuant to section 381.0012(5), Florida Statutes, "it shall be the duty of every state and county attorney, sheriff, police officer, and other appropriate city and county officials upon the request to assist the Department of Health" in enforcing any isolation or quarantine, state health law and order of the Department of Health issued pursuant to this Order.

Section 4. This Executive Order shall expire upon the expiration of Executive Order 20-52, including any extensions, or upon an Executive Order lifting the isolation or quarantine after advice from the State Health Officer and Surgeon General.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-86

(Emergency Management - COVID-19 –Additional Requirements of Certain Individuals
Traveling to Florida)

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, I issued Executive Order number 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, I issued Executive Order number 20-82 directing all persons from an area with substantial community spread who enter the State of Florida to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days; and

WHEREAS, as Governor, I am responsible for meeting the dangers presented to this state and its people by this emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1.

A. I hereby direct all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the State of Louisiana, inclusive of those entering the State of Florida by roadways, to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter. This section shall not apply to persons performing military, emergency, health or infrastructure response, or persons involved in any commercial activity. This Order shall take effect immediately and apply retroactively to all persons who have entered Florida after being in any area with substantial community spread. All persons isolating or quarantining under this Section shall be responsible for all costs associated with their isolation or quarantine, including transportation, lodging, food, medical care and any other expenses to sustain the person during the period of isolation or quarantine.

B. I hereby direct all persons covered under Section 1(A) of this Order to inform any individual in Florida with whom they have had direct physical contact in the past 21 days that they traveled from an area with substantial community spread.

C. I direct the establishment of appropriate checkpoints on the roadways for those persons and vehicles entering the State of Florida and to require those persons to provide information, including in a written form, regarding the origin of their travel and on the address of their location of isolation or quarantine for a period of 14 days. I further direct the Florida Department of Transportation to facilitate locations for appropriate checkpoints, including at welcome centers and rest stops, and to facilitate the placement of road signs and advisories to provide information on this Order and to direct traffic to the appropriate checkpoint.

D. Pursuant to sections 252.36(5)(b) and 252.47, Florida Statutes, the Florida Highway Patrol and County Sheriffs are directed to assist with the establishment of appropriate checkpoints, the flow of traffic to those checkpoints and any enforcement actions.

Section 2. Failure to follow Section 1 of this Order is a second-degree misdemeanor pursuant to section 252.50, Florida Statutes, and is punishable by imprisonment not to exceed 60 days, a fine not to exceed \$500, or both.

Section 3.

A. Pursuant to section 252.47, Florida Statutes, I hereby direct all state, county and local law enforcement authorities to enforce this Order. Any law enforcement authority that interacts with a person in violation of Section 1(A) of this Order shall immediately report the individual, along with personal identifying and contact information, to the Florida Department of Health.

B. Pursuant to section 381.0012(5), Florida Statutes, "it shall be the duty of every state and county attorney, sheriff, police officer, and other appropriate city and county officials upon the request to assist the Department of Health" in enforcing any isolation or quarantine, state health law and order of the Department of Health issued pursuant to this Order.

Section 4. To the extent necessary, the exceptions of this Executive Order are applicable to Executive Order 20-80, Section 1(A) and 20-82, Section 1(A).

Section 5. This Executive Order shall expire upon the expiration of Executive Order 20-52, including any extensions, or upon an Executive Order lifting the isolation or quarantine after advice from the State Health Officer and Surgeon General.
